What We're Learning:

Reading: Our survival unit continues, and many students have already finished their first book. This week we covered more lessons on compare and contrast and vocabulary strategies. We took our strategies a step further by comparing and contrasting two different genres of text and examining if the authors had the same opinions on the shared topic in the text.

Writing: We have begun drafting our opinion writing essay in class and have started to look at ways we can improve our craft. We made our writing more interesting this week by adding an anecdote (a short, personal story) to one or more of our body paragraphs and have done some self-assessment with the opinion checklist.

Math: We have been working hard on learning many different division algorithms. This week, we learned how to represent the area model process of division and with problems with and without remainders. Practice is critical for these new multiplication and division algorithms.

Science: We have started another science unit called Water, Water Everywhere. This science unit outlines different processes to filter water. Students are learning about the engineering design process and will apply what they've learned about the Ganges River to design an actual water filter.
