## 4th Grade News 9-27-19

## What We're Learning:

**Reading:** This week's mini lessons covered how to read intensely to grow substantial ideas. We practiced "stop and jots" when we had important information to collect/share with others. We also talked about how to make sure what books we are choosing are not too hard and continue to develop a culture of reading in our room. We also started differentiated small groups which I like to call WIN (What I Need) Time. Students practiced how to do a chronological retell of what was read and synthesizing that information into a summary.

**Writing:** Students continue to make exciting progress with their realistic fiction stories. This week we worked on revising our work in multiple ways. Students took the time to revise their lead, elaborated on setting and worked on the difficult task of weaving together action, thought, and dialogue. While not all students are ready to end their stories, we also talked about methods to write powerful endings.

**Math:** This week was comprised of a lot of review work on rounding using a model, the vertical number line. We also learned the "shortcut" to rounding without using a model. Ask your child what this looks like. Students can round up to the nearest hundred thousand and have applied this knowledge to real world situations, asking themselves what makes sense when rounding in real situations. We also reviewed for our mid-module assessment and took the assessment today.

**Science:** Science work continues with our Earth, Sun, Moon mini-unit. Students learned about Earth's shape (there's no flat earthers here!) and how gravity works. We learned that gravity is an invisible force that acts upon all objects. We

also got to take part in an amazing visit from the Pacific Science Center's in-house field trip to the planetarium.
